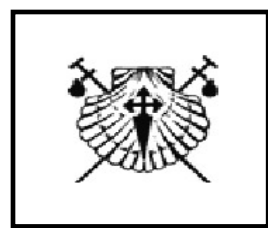

### **World Youth Day in Madrid, Spain August 2011.**

The "Days in the Diocese" (DED) will take place in 61 Spanish dioceses (over Gibraltar and Bayonne) from 11 to 15 August before the World Youth Day. Plans are being made to welcome world youth to programs of these days before the Madrid Papal visit, and will vary from diocese to diocese. An integration of Spanish cultural, historical tours, holiday times, especially times of prayer and celebration of faith in Jesus Christ are included by the parishes. Spain has many shrines and pilgrimage sites as part of local religious identity. Each diocese will offer free accommodation in schools, parochial schools, gymnasiums and private homes. Each diocese plans vary with respect to maintenance, or in some cases will be offered free of charge, but other pilgrims will be asked a small contribution to cover economic costs to poorer parishes. ### **LA CAPELLA de SANTO NIÑO en Chimayo**

In my last visit to Chimayo, one I make as often as possible, usually with cousins, Judy, Gertrude and friend Tina, we make a point to take a day out of our busy lives, for this enchanting pilgrimage, as passed down. Leaving Albuquerque by 8:30am in order to make daily morning Mass at El Santuario De Chimayo, allows us a few hours for personal prayer and meditation. We also seek out dear Fr. Rocca for a blessing and conversation, after going through the gift shops. Finally making a stop at "La Capilla de Santo Niño de Atocha" on our way out, to Ranchos de Chimayo for dinner, was a surprise.

This time as I approached, "La Capilla de Santo Niño" I wondered why two modern cartoon type angels were placed at the entrance. (Odd indeed) but soon found they signaled the odd changes inside. Never could I have imagined such profound and complete destruction of this very simple rural and humble chapel would have happened. This place that held an essence, an emphasis of life experienced by its early Spanish founders. For me it was a small connection to my past. The rural, Spanish Provincial historic traditions were once felt here. This rarest of New Mexican Spanish "Capallas", of my childhood had reflected, my heritage, a Spanish presence of past, whose simple forms spoke to its origins. Now gone, it is a treasure I will miss. The Spanish Founding Culture, their Catholic traditions and practices as reflected in the minimal material resources present in that presentation at, "La Capilla de Santo Niño," is a difficult reality to accept, but one I must. I am still perplexed at how what is in its place seems like a "mockery" to what had been and is now. Does everything have to be about commerce? At minimum, I still feel insulted.

I have not had anyone else express their amazement about this, but I truly regret the loss and than what it was replaced with. I think of my ancestors and what they felt as they saw the New Mexican Spanish history and culture disregarded in their times and lives, as well. I realize life is change, and one adjusts in time, as loss is inevitable and we accept.
